

Combining Moulding

Finding the look you want for a particular print isn't always easy. Do you like the color of one moulding but the width of another? Maybe you can't decide between moulding patterns. The answer may be to use more than one.

Combining different moulding styles and materials is a great way to achieve the look you want. You can stack two or more mouldings to create a single frame that fits your style. If you have a seascape you'd like to frame, you can combine blue and green

mouldings to complement the colors in the print. Or choose colors found in the room where your frame will hang. Do you have brown in your bedroom? Incorporate it by stacking brown and white mouldings.

Of course, stacking moulding isn't just for decorative purposes; it can be functional as well. If you love the color and pattern of a moulding but it isn't available in the width you need, stack two or more together. Stacked mouldings can also be used to create a deeper frame for dimensional objects. ■
